- Provide appropriate support to evaluate your choices for university admission.

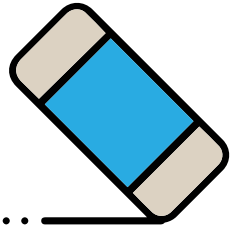

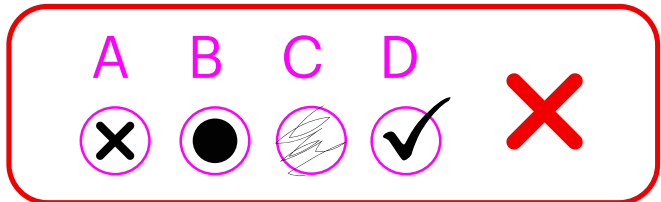
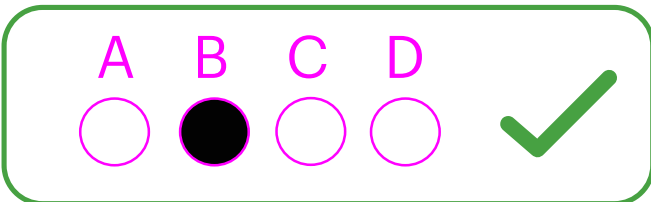
A Multiple Choice Question Paper

General Instructions

Dear Student,

1. Set a timetable to review and practise the past national examinations papers.
2. Ensure you get enough sleep the night before the examination, so you can focus during the examination.
3. Wake up with sufficient time and have a healthy breakfast.
4. Arrive at school well ahead of the examination's start time.
5. Read the questions paper carefully before answering and make sure to answer all questions in the paper, and don't forget to shade the bubbles correctly on the answer sheet in multiple choice questions.
6. Bring your official ID card or a copy of it.
7. Do not write your name or personal ID number on the examination paper or answer sheet.
8. Bring all the necessary tools and materials you may need, such as: a pencil, blue pen, ruler,.... etc.
9. You will face partial or complete grade deprivation in the following cases:
 - Taking the examination on behalf of another student or impersonating them.
 - Possessing any unauthorised materials or devices that may give you an unfair advantage, such as: electronic devices and mobile phones.
 - Cheating or violating instructions in any form.
10. Once the examination starts, you should not speak inside the examinations hall, communicating with other students by any way, seeking help from or providing assistance to another students or causing any disturbance. Also, you must not borrow anything from another student during the examination.
11. You must follow the invigilator's instructions and refrain from asking them to explain the examination questions.
12. Immediately inform the invigilator if:
 - You do not receive the correct examination paper.
 - The number of pages in the examination paper is incomplete or if the printing is unclear.
 - You feel that your performance on the examination day may be affected due to a health issue or any other reason.
13. You will not be allowed to leave the examinations hall until half of the designated examination time has passed.
14. Before leaving the examinations hall, you must submit all the examination papers to the invigilator.



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
